- The GED Program, a small group course which prepares students for the computer base GED exam. All coursework is aligned to the Common Core Standards.
- Additionally, there is the English as a Second Language program, a one-on-one program allowing non-native English speakers to gain basic English reading, writing, math, and speaking skills.
