### **ACTIVITY: What's a Habitat? Book**

Customize your habitat book by coloring, drawing, and labeling the pages in the printout, "What's a Habitat?"

#### **ACTIVITY: Animal Cracker Habitats**

## **ACTIVITY: Create a Creature**

Your Challenge: Create a brand new animal that would live in a particular habitat. Choose any habitat you'd like! Create your animal using your homemade playdough (or you can use other craft supplies). Describe what makes your new animal perfectly suited to its habitat.

#### Playdough Ingredients:

- 1 cup all-purpose flour
- 1/4 cup fine table salt
- 1 teaspoon cream of tartar
- 1/2 tablespoon vegetable oil
- 1/2 cup boiling water
- Food coloring (optional)

### **READING CHALLENGE**

#### Instructions:

- 1. In a bowl, mix together flour, salt, and cream of tartar.
- 2. Make a well in the center of the bowl and add vegetable oil, boiling water and food coloring.
- 3. Using a rubber spatula, stir until a dough forms, add a little bit more flour if needed. (add more food coloring if desired)
- 4. When the dough is cool enough to touch, use your hands to further incorporate the flour and knead until all flour is incorporated and dough is soft and uniform in color.
- 5. Let playdough cool completely before playing with it.
- 6. Store the playdough in a sandwich bag and place the sandwich bags in an air-tight food storage container. Store room temperature, no need to refrigerate.
