Genesee County Youth Corps offers three programs addressing homelessness:

REACH is for youths aged 10 through 17, and provides free shelter and comfortable living for up to 21 days. Parental consent must be given, and the youth has the choice to stay or not. Free counseling

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services are provided for up to 90 days, for all youths, sheltered or not.
