



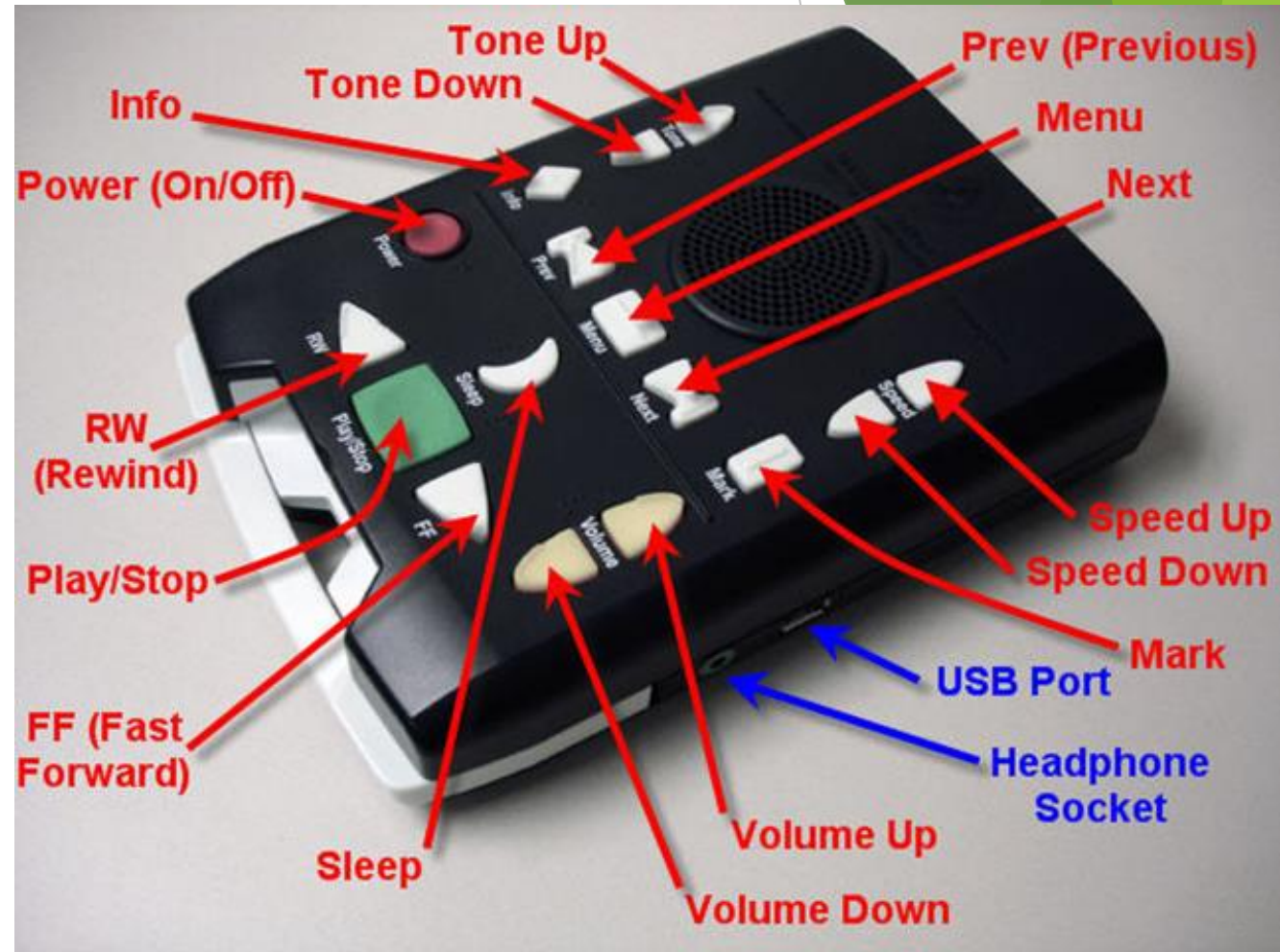
Braille and Talking Book Library (BTBL)

Including a talking book player (pictured right).



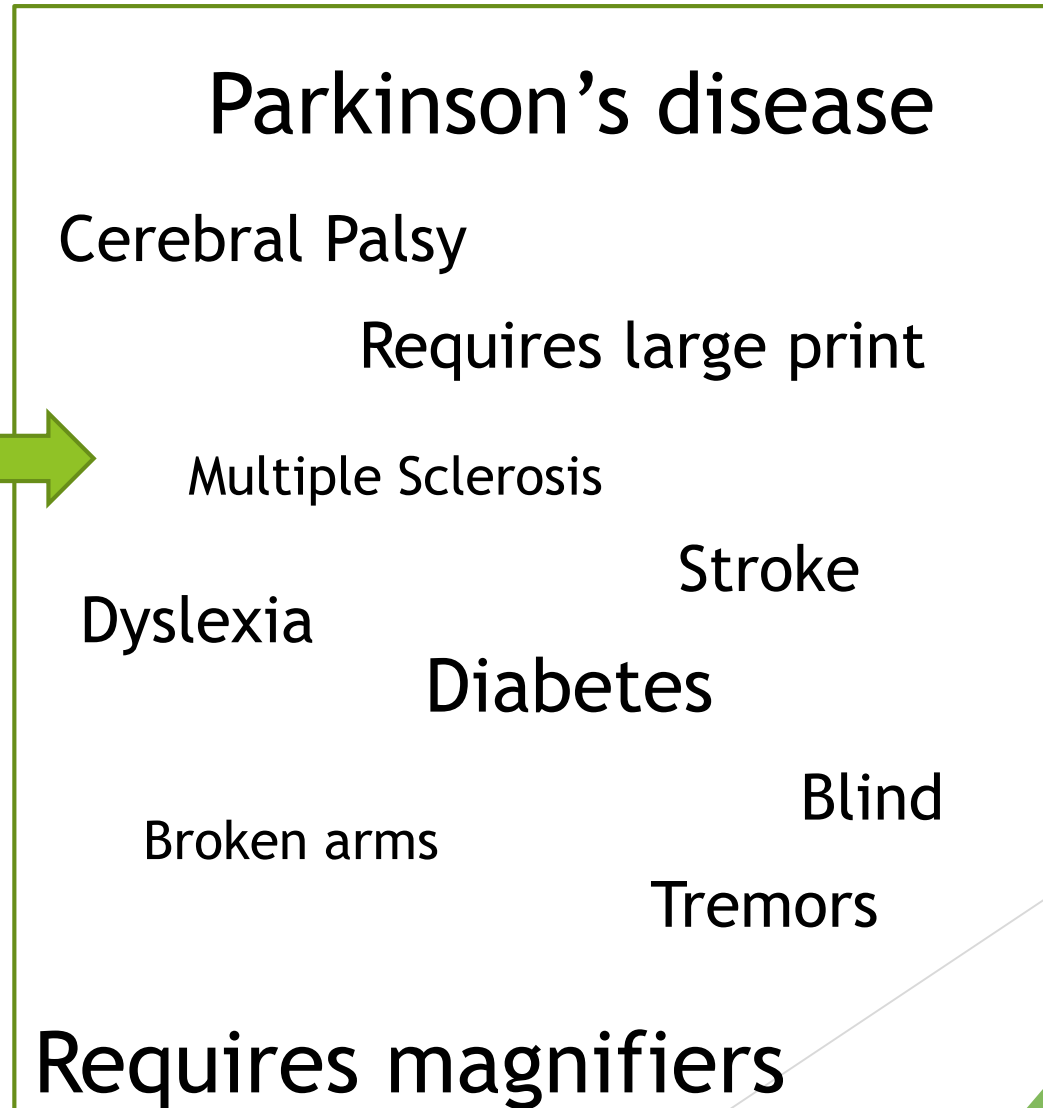
Services Offered
